DISCUSSION	Welcome everyone. I have four items on my report. We are in the middle of testing. I have been here for 14 years, and I can't recall the testing as good as this year. The ladies have done an amazing job along with the school faculty. I believe we hit our benchmark which is around 95 percent. A big shoutout to Bodanyi, Bojorquez, and Wilson for making this happen. Mrs. Mayersohn thank you also with the coordination of our testing. Once again outstanding job to everyone involved with our testing. Hiring is going well; we have another interview today at 2:30 and we liked her and I'm going to call her on my way home to official offer her the job. She will be here next week, but hopefully she accepts, but I think were down to one or two jobs that are open right now. That's a message I wanted to relay to the kids as a hole. There is handful of teachers who have actual chosen the job because how respectful the kids were. From their walk to the parking lot into the office. Those things, opening the door, telling someone good morning or saying welcome to Pueblo, it means something to folks. The kids have been very respectful with who we hired and that makes a difference. Hiring is going great and this two are going to the hiring fair for our last two hires. Bell schedule is going, the PD team is sending it tomorrow and it looks like bell schedule number two which is one though seven against what we have now. Teacher will have a week or more to respond and we'll see what we have for next school year. I received the survey on the bond where I had to push high priority to low priority, so I prioritized furniture and building renovations alone with painting all the exterior of the school. I did have some add on items; I believe the gym needs an up dated speaker system. The football field also needs one

because when it turns on there is sparks everywhere. Its so old they don't even have parts to repair them. I don't know how this happens in the second largest school district. I think this is unacceptable. Low priority I put like gas meters, that the kids don't feel or see. Yes, it helps but its not a direct impact, so I submitted that, and I hope to have a good week with the bond. I believe things are going smooth. I saw more teacher at prom than I ever had. They had a good time and danced the night away, had fun. As a principal, parent it was nice to see teacher involved having and enjoying the moment. It was a good feeling to see on Saturday night. That all for me. I'll now answer any question you may have. Will the CTE program (graphic design) come back next year? We will not offer graphic design next school year. What we are starting is an engineering program next year. We have the teacher for the program, it will be Mr. McCauley. Are there going to be any renovations to the baseball facilities? Yes, about two hundred gran is going towards field repairs. I believe baseball needs two things: lights and a scoreboard to be up to date. Unfortunately, there is no funding in the bond for those items. My recommendation is going and looking for money through grants or any other way we can. You must go out there and get it. One last recommendation is going and talking to the board on the bond monies. I will look at being able to find funds to improve all our ground facilities that are crying for help.
