REPORTS TO REVIEW	Mr. Rosthenhausler, Principal Report
DISCUSSION	<p>Good evening and I'm going to open with climate and culture in quarter two. We had a rocky climate and it's something we had to repair with teacher. I'm happy to report it looks like the ship is sailing in the right direction. Things could become interesting in March or April with some tough decisions having to be make that could ignite some climate issues. I'm happy to report that things have been smooth, the kids have been great. I have not been hearing from TEA or teachers at large about things happening in school that they are unhappy with. This is where we have new systems mandate that Science and English have to follow new curriculum stated by TUSD but it seems to be going smooth. I'm extremely excited about that.</p> <p>It's testing time so; I'm going to loop in two things. I was taking to the principal of Sabino and what the do for their juniors is a massive incentive program. It will call into play student council if you over see sports, so what they did was create a chart. Say that composite score fell at 20 you would get free prom tickets the following year or you would get free admission to all home games. Also, maybe a free parking space. I'm going to talk to teachers tomorrow to see how creative we could be to incentivize this test, because truly lots of our kids don't take it seriously that ACT and ultimately that decides 50 percent of the letter grade is about that test. So, 70 percent of the kids just mark C or draw a design. It's not a true indicator how well the teachers are teaching and how mush the students are internalizing so I like what Sabino said, so if you can think of any other cool creative incentives. I bring this to site council because if you incentivize, like pay for their AP exams the following year. That means that site council would have to pay for it. For me, I think it's worth it. I don't see a lot of downsides to it, and I want to be as creative and aggressive with this as possible. I believe our kids know more than they are showing on that exam. It is testing time so kids and parents you're going to see a lot of funky schedules, like class starts currently, we have ASVAP, it's just public education.</p> <p>I want to highlight a few things; we had other Finn finalist, Ms. Avey Valencia and over the past we've had kids accepted to Yale, Stanford, step above, U of A, ASU, and one of mu cousins was accepted to San Francisco and it just started we have a ton of talented kids that have not committed. I'm pleased with that. Another highlights our girls where ranked number one and things happen. If we win on Friday, we</p>

have a legit chance to be ranked number one in the state. We have one player that is a legit star, probably the best in the history of the school, so if you can be there Friday it would be nice to have a massive crowd. This is regarding girls' basketball. In wrestling we are projected to have a few qualify for state. It's always my favorite event to go. On the flip side we have been hearing lots about ICE, I've been speaking to some classes, and I believe we are following the protocol we received from TUSD. All administration receives the same guidelines. There is no gray area we just must follow what we have in place. I fell confident about that. I doubt they will show up on campus and I feel us four are ready if anything should happen. One last thing; Sabino has a very stiff policy, Rincon is going to follow suite, I'm going to approach teachers tomorrow to if they are interested in a stiffer phone policy. All it is we buy these cases, and the students put their phones. The teacher has a key, they are like 60 dollars per classroom. I can tell you I speak for a lot of teachers and some parents that cell phones are a real issue. It's also a big issue with depression and so many other things. There are some positive things about it, but it has changed our kids. If there is a way to curve it, I want to do my part and see if teacher would join me. I'll be talking with them tomorrow. It's about 60 per case, so I figure it's going to be about 7 to 8 thousand. Finally, it's parent-teacher conferences Thursday and Friday night, I believe it's half day on Friday.

Questions for Mr. R; comment by Mr. Avila that student do take the ACT testing seriously. I see students everyday and inform them about the importance of this test.

Question: what is the TUSD policy on phones? Mr. Trujillo informed us that every school must come up with there own school phone policy. There will be many details that will have to be worked out in implementing this new phone policy.

Question: what happened with the renovation of our bathrooms? They came and saw but decided not to do anything with our bathrooms. I was not pleased with them telling me that.
