- AZ UNIVERSITIES accept C's and above for university required courses.
 4 Creation
 4 Creation
- For full-ride or full-tuition scholarships, students must earn A's or B's in the Sweet 16 AZ university required courses.
- If you are taking dual enrollment Pima CC or University of Arizona classes, earn no less than A's, B's, or C's.
- D's and F's in dual enrollment courses will put students in academic probation that will negatively impact their financial aid.

State Requirements

Pass 23 credits (D or better) in all the required areas

CPR

- All State Requirements Plus
 - Completion of FAFSA: There are exceptions.
 See Mrs. Dillenburg or Dr. Avila about this.
 - Return of all checked out equipment (i.e., Laptop, Hotspot, Library Books, Sports Equipment, etc.)
 - Payment of all fees
 - Completion of Senior Survey

Information from your senior counselor

• No more schedule changes

- Credit recovery outside of Tucson Unified School District (TUSD)
 - IE: Primavera Online, Marana Distance Learning
 - Permission Form
 - No grades, only P/F, so it won't help your GPA for college and scholarship applications. Keep in mind that universities need to see letter grades to calculate Sweet 16 GPA's. This may also negatively impact NCAA eligibility.
- ParentVue Front Office Staff and valid ID
- Graduation Status Meetings and Letters that will be mailed home
- Student Profile and letter of recommendation requests 2 week's notice
- Tutoring is available before and after school in the library.

- FSA ID Accounts Workshops available in October after fall break. Specific dates will be announced.
- U of A, NAU and ASU offer merit scholarships based on GPA.
- DACA or Undocumented students who have attended a high school in the U.S. for at least two years qualify for in-state tuition under prop 308.

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

How do you qualify?

- Students must complete ALL requirements listed below:
- The student must successfully complete all English Language Arts (ELA) requirements for graduation with an overall grade point average in those classes of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale.
- The student must attain the required score on an English language assessment approved by the Arizona Board of Education.
- Students must demonstrate proficiency in a second language through an assessment approved by the Arizona Board of Education or an alternative evidence model.

What is the Seal of Biliteracy and how is it documented?

- Documented on High School
 Diploma and transcript
- Given by the state to show proficiency in more than one language.
