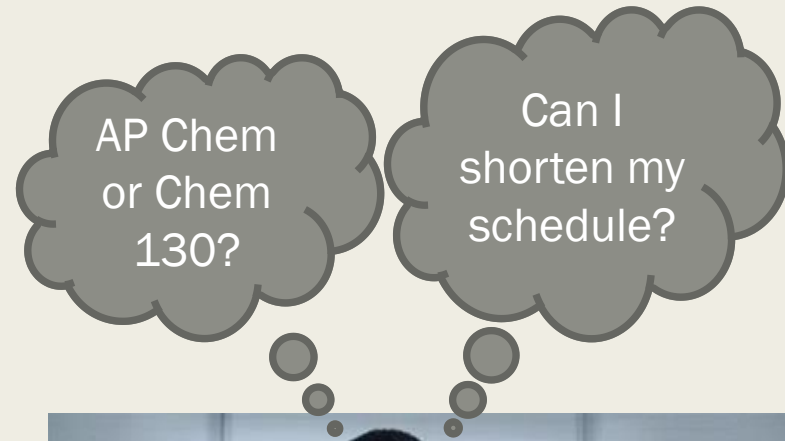

# If you are planning to request a reduced schedule for your senior year...

- You will need to fill out the Petition to Reduce Schedule Form at the end of your Junior Year.
- The form is found in the Counseling Link of the Pueblo website.
- Your counselor of record will review your request and graduation status in June. If you qualify for a reduced schedule, it may be granted.
- Universities do not recommend that you have a reduced schedule your senior year.

# AP – Advanced Placement

- It is recommended that if you select AP courses, that you have earned an A or B in that subject.
- Understand that there is 1.50 hours of homework every night.
- Your attendance also needs to be very good, because you can fall behind very quickly when you are absent.
- AP courses are strongly recommended if you plan to attend college or university, especially Ivy League schools.
- Challenge yourself to take at least 1 AP class every year in a subject you are academically strong in.

**CR** = Culturally Relevant course: This is an English or History course taught in the perspective of different cultures.

**DE** = Dual Enrollment credit: Students have the option to receive both Pueblo & college/university credit. If you plan to take a Dual Enrollment class, make sure to register for Pima Community College and take the assessments. **See Dr. Avila.**

**DL** = Dual Language: Students have the option of being in bilingual classes. A bilingual waiver signed by your family is required.

## Core courses you will select

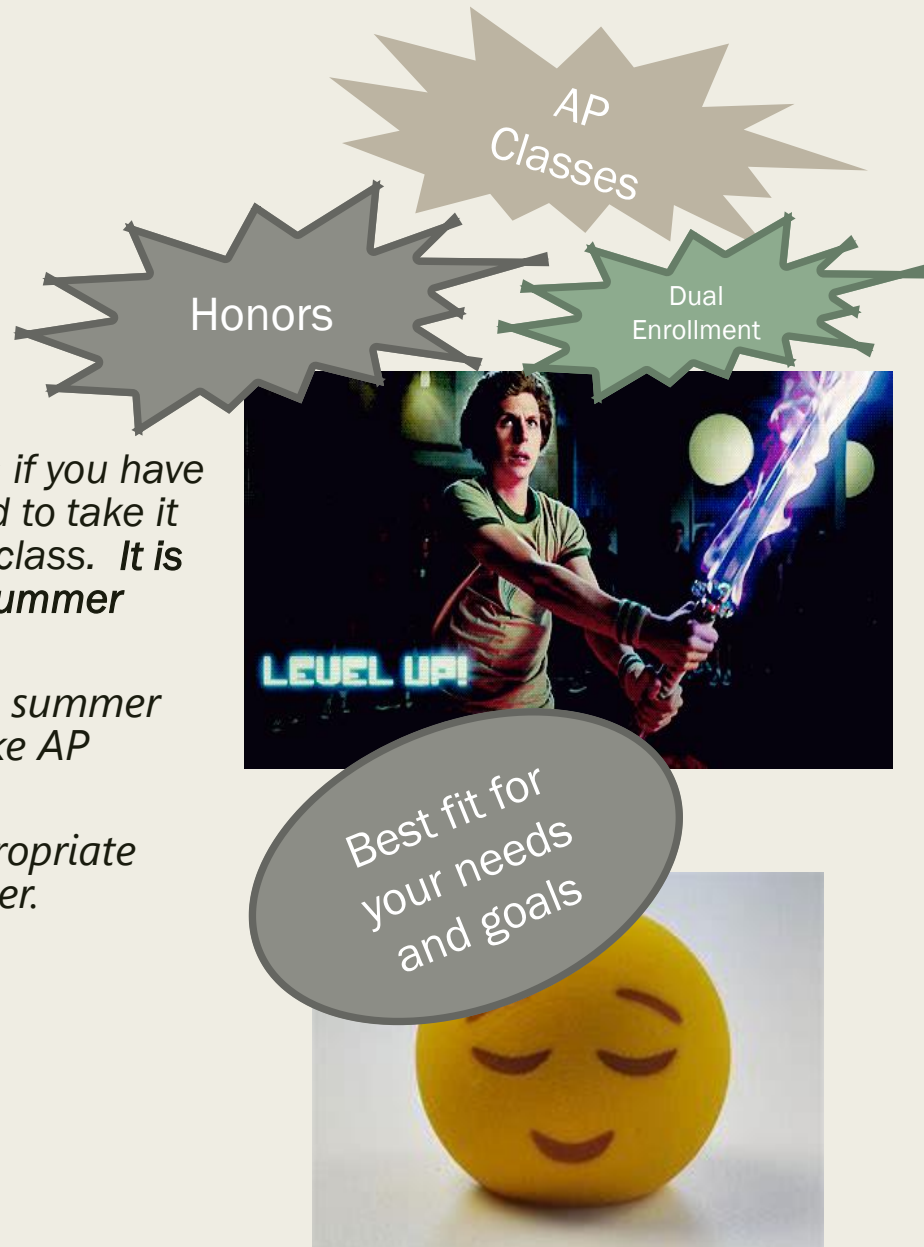
1. A regular or advanced English course

2. A regular or advanced History course

3. A regular or advanced Math course

- *You are able to select remedial courses if you have failed math previously, but you will need to take it concurrently with the grade level math class. **It is best if you take a failed math class in summer school.***
- *It is preferable to take Geometry in the summer after freshman year if you wants to take AP Calculus senior year.*
- *It is important to discuss the most appropriate math placement with your math teacher.*

4. A regular or advanced science course



- You will need to select 3 primary electives and 3 alternate electives.



# Abbreviations continued...

- + = Audition, interview, pre-requisite or entrance exam required
- ~ = After school practice, performances, and events are required throughout the school year, such as Band, Theatre, Warrior News, Yearbook, and Newspaper.
- Note: All elective courses listed run year-long, except for Health, PE, Weights, and Body Conditioning.

**a.** If you plan to attend a 4-year university, you will need 2 years of the **SAME** world language. Ivy League and other elite colleges and universities require that you take **3 or more years** of the same world language.
