A Word from our Principal......

With August comes a new school year full of hopes and dreams. In the first month as principal of Pueblo High School my appreciation for teachers, students, staff and the community has reached new heights. I have been fortunate enough to visit classrooms daily and I am impressed with the commitment to the idea that relationships with our students precedes the delivery of content. The students at Pueblo have been extremely respectful in classrooms allowing teachers to smoothly transition from relationships to content with little drop off in pace. While the school year is off to a relatively smooth start, we recognize the parking situation has caused confusion amongst us all.
