I wanted to let you know about two very important assessments that are coming up.

Beginning Monday, September 24th and continuing through Thursday, September 27th we will be conducting our Quarter I District Benchmark testing. This test is a mastery model test which means that is designed to assess the content being taught in the classroom. These benchmark tests are an important measure of your child's achievement and the teacher's efficacy in the classroom in the areas of reading, writing, and math. Each

quarter teachers carefully analyze the data from these benchmark tests and use the information to make adjustments to their lesson plans. In addition this information is used to identify students who may be in need of additional literacy or math supports.

On Wednesday, October 24th all freshmen, sophomores, and juniors will be taking the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test). This assessment is an opportunity to prepare for similar college entrance exams they will

take later in their educational careers as well as to potentially qualify for numerous scholarships.

Your assistance in making sure that your child(ren) are in school those days (and every other day) is greatly appreciated. In addition please encourage your child(ren) to always do their best, now and in the future.
