The purpose of the mester and are a freshmen, sophomore or junior, can grade replacement can be completed by participation in 21st Century (CCLC) online classes for FREE. Applications are available in the Counseling Office. Student athletes who plan to participate in college sports and want to grade replace a class must take the course with a teacher; grade replacing a class online will make a student athlete INELIGI-BLE per the NCAA. ACT test is to measure a high school student's readiness for college, and provide colleges with one common data point that can be used to compare all applicants. College admissions officers will review standardized test scores alongside other important measures like GPA, letters of recommendation from teachers or mentors, extracurricular activities, and personal essays.
