Mr. Sandoval has secured funding through the CCLC program in the amount of \$850.00 the total cost of the program is \$1,087.00 for the season. ITEM TITLE	Request for \$1,000.00 for Graduation Stage Repairs Presented by: Melina Montiel
DISCUSSION NOTES	<p>Contractor has requested another \$1,000.00 to repair the ramps columns for the Graduation Stage.</p> <p>No Contract was presented to Site Council as stated in November 10, 2020 Meeting. Request is for the Graduation Ramps to be repaired.</p> <p>Questions: In \$6,000.00 re-approved amount included; Stage clean-up, repainting of Stage, Extending of Ramps, & \$800.00 set-up/break-down. Why was this not included in the written agreement? The columns (legs) were not included in the quote.</p> <p>Parent: Has the Stage been Built? Why weren't the ramps built correctly the first time?</p> <p>Mr. R requested an Addendum to this: Can Site Council assist with pursuing other safer less costly Graduation Stage option for the future. More so something that can be done in house.</p> <p>Parent: It was with understanding that this Stage was to be an investment for years to come. However the \$7,000.00 for repairs is costly if going to be a yearly item.</p> <p>The storage currently being used is this the area originally stated to be built? Mr. Lopez; no, the ticket we decided to accept was a much cheaper ticket for which did not include the storage enclosure and or columns.</p> <p>Has there been any other funding source and or request made other than Site Council? Mrs. Montiel stated that she has looked at other options however none have worked.</p> <p>Parent: Is this normally typically that the District provides or is this something that is handled by the school? Mr. Lopez; the District does provide a Stage, however a parent group decided to do something different for which is how Pueblo received this new Stage.</p>
